

## Easy Languages Students Migrate to Lingoda, Get Full Benefits of New Virtual Classroom

Lingoda migrated all its own students to the new virtual classroom earlier this year. The response has been overwhelmingly positive with teachers and students praising the platform's HD video, crystal-clear sound and reliable connection, even where internet bandwidth is limited.

Felix Wunderlich, co-founder and CEO, Lingoda, says: "The new Zoom-based platform offers a quantum leap forward in the student and teacher experience. Skype was a satisfactory platform when we founded Easy Languages in 2012, but online learning has advanced rapidly. Now students expect a far richer classroom experience. Merging Easy Languages with Lingoda enables us to deliver just that."

Former Easy Languages students can continue with one-to-one classes, but can now also take advantage of less expensive group classes. They also benefit from learning

with a wider pool of teachers, exposing them to different accents and cultural knowledge. Students who complete the required number of classes also receive certificates based on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

Felix Wunderlich says: "Online education is changing fast. Listening carefully to teacher and student feedback has enabled us to take our classroom experience to the next level, and we continue to research and enhance the platform."
